

After working as a nurse for 8 years she joined the US Army Reserve Nurse Corps and served the military for over 30 years. She has been a volunteer for decades. Dottie is the Chairperson of the Community Outreach Ministry at St. Alban's Episcopal Church. Their Pillowcase Ministry has made and distributed 1,500 pillowcases to nursing homes in Onondaga County. She also makes quilts

and quilt blocks as part of the Towpath Quilt Guild and the Sankofa Piecemakers Quilting Group for community service projects. Dottie volunteered at Elmcrest Children's Center for 17 years.

### Priestly Ponderings, by Mother Julie+

The morning of Pentecost (May 20) was glorious at St. Alban's as our three East Side Episcopalians churches (Emmanuel, East Syracuse and St. David's, DeWitt) celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit. St. Alban's Quartet and St. David's Choir provided beautiful and uplifting music, as we directed our thanks and praise heavenward. Many people were wearing red, the color of the Holy Spirit, and the Rev. Kathy Corley of St. David's preached a spirit-filled sermon.

Why all the fuss, you ask? Pentecost is a major feast day for it is the day that the Holy Spirit was bestowed on the 120 disciples who formed the first Christian congregation. Led by Peter, the leader of Jesus' 12 disciples, they were gathered together on the Jewish feast of Pentecost in Jerusalem, where Jesus had told them to wait until they were "clothed with power from on high." Ten days ago Jesus had ascended into heaven in sight of the 11 faithful disciples, and since that moment they had been waiting for Jesus' promise to be fulfilled. As they were gathered together suddenly the sound of a great wind and tongues as of fire rested on each one of them as they received the Holy Spirit. They went out into the streets proclaiming the good news of God in Jesus Christ with great power, and the Bible tells us that on that day 3000 people professed the faith - Jesus Christ is the Son of God - and the Church was born!

Without the Holy Spirit there would be no Church, for it is the Spirit which makes Jesus present at all times and in all places. It is the Spirit that brings to our remembrance Jesus' teaching and helps us interpret it for the times in which we live. It is the Spirit who guides us in the way we are to go, and prompts us to respond as Jesus would have us respond to others. That still, small voice inside you; that nudge you feel or that sudden thought you had; that new understanding of the Bible that comes as you are reading it; that "aha" moment - all these are ways in which the Holy Spirit leads and inspires us.

However, and this is important (!), the work of the Holy Spirit does not end here. Jesus prepared the disciples to testify before rulers and kings. He told them in Luke 11:11-12, "When they bring you before the synagogues, the rulers, and the authorities, do not worry about how you are to defend yourselves or what you are to say; for the Holy Spirit will teach you at that very hour what you ought to say." This was necessary because the new thing that God had accomplished in Jesus Christ had to be told them. Talk about speaking Truth to power! Yet God did not send them in unaided, but with the power of the Holy Spirit. When the time comes, the Spirit of God always will provide what is needed in the moment. But notice this, the disciples put themselves in situations where they would be called on to proclaim the Gospel. The disciples acted fearlessly because they believed that Jesus Christ was the Son of God with all their heart, mind, soul, and strength. They were beaten, brutalized, and martyred, but still the Church's missionaries boldly went forth to proclaim the Good News. They knew they followed a crucified Lord, counted the cost, and went forth in the Name of Jesus.

On May 17 our Presiding Bishop, the Most Rev. Michael Curry, preached the love of Jesus Christ before royalty at Prince Harry's wedding. On May 20 Grace Joseph testified at our Pentecost service about David's medical assistance to a stranger in need and the power of prayer. Both kinds of living the Gospel are so urgently needed in our world. Today, when so very many of our youth and young adults receive no religious training and must choose for themselves which religion to observe, if they choose one at all, the message of the forgiveness and reconciliation with God through the cross and resurrection of Jesus Christ needs to be shared boldly by all Christians. Let us go forth into the world, rejoicing in the power of the Spirit. Thanks be to God.

Join us for food, fellowship and worship.


